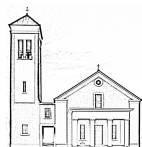

Norms for Indulgences at the Commemoration of All Souls:

- From twelve o' clock noon on 1st Nov until midnight on 2nd Nov, all who have confessed, received Holy Communion and prayed for the pope's intentions (one Our Father and Hail Mary, or any other prayer of one's choice) can gain one plenary indulgence by visiting a church or oratory, and there reciting one Our Father and the Apostle's Creed.
This indulgence is applicable only to the souls of the departed.

Confession may be made at any time within the week preceding or the week following 1st Nov.

Holy communion may be received on any day from 1st Nov to the 8th Nov.

- The faithful who visit a cemetery and pray for the dead may gain a plenary indulgence applicable only to the Holy Souls on the usual conditions once per day from the 1st Nov to the 8th Nov. The conditions mentioned above apply also for this.

What are Indulgences?

Indulgences are the remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven. The faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains the indulgence under prescribed conditions for either himself or the departed. Indulgences are granted through the ministry of the Church which, as the dispenser of the grace of redemption, distributes the treasury of the merits of Christ and the Saints.

Though for the Day: On the 2nd Nov, it is especially important to recall the Church's teaching that there is indeed a Purgatory in which the souls of the saved but imperfect are awaiting the fulfilment of their purification and healing, and that these souls can be greatly helped by the prayers, sacrifices and Masses offered by the living. This is an aspect of the Catholic patrimony that must not be forgotten or de-emphasised. Justice demands that our brothers and sisters in the faith who have died find in us faithful friends who acknowledge that it is indeed a good and pious thing to pray for the dead.

Cemetery Collection: Will be taken up at all masses this weekend.

Altar List of the Dead: Please enter the names of the deceased on your altar list of the dead for the coming year and place in the dead list envelope and return to the church.
